### Local Points of Interest

#### ***Old Colorado City (ROUTE HIGHLIGHT)***

This national historic district, formerly Colorado City, was founded in 1859 by the Colorado Town Company who anticipated that the city would be a major supply hub for the new gold mines in South Park and the Blue River. Today, Old Colorado City serves as a shopping district that includes dozens of independently owned boutiques, restaurants and art galleries such as The Michael Garman Museum & Gallery.

#### ***Rock Ledge Ranch (ROUTE HIGHLIGHT)***

Rock Ledge Ranch Historic Site contains significant buildings dated back to the early 1800's where you can take a journey and explore historical reenactments of the lifestyles of all the Pikes Peak Region's early inhabitants, including the Ute and Plains Indians who lived along the Central Front Range of the Rocky Mountains and through historical reenactment. The American Indian area is the only area west of the Mississippi.

#### ***Garden of the Gods Club/Kissing Camels (ROUTE HIGHLIGHT)***

For more than 60 years, this private club and resort, which sits high atop a mesa, has provided its members with incredible amenities, delightful spa treatments, fine dining and spectacular views of snow-capped Pikes Peak and the Garden of the Gods National Landmark. Members and guests can also experience a round of world-class golf and play the 27-hole classic championship course at Kissing Camels.

Originally built in 1871 by General William Jackson Palmer, this first-class hotel was designed to welcome tourists from around the world who came to visit. After being rebuilt in 1901 and then again in 1967, it is still located in its original location in the center of downtown. The Antler, A Wyndham Hotel Colorado Springs is open today and hosts business and leisure travelers from around the world and conventions. It also offers multiple restaurants and a 24 hour health club and museums all within walking distance.

### ***Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College (ROUTE HIGHLIGHT)***

This nationally renowned art museum boasts a collection of more than 20,000 works of art and 4,000 cultural artifacts. Known for permanent collections of American art, blockbuster touring exhibitions and award-winning theater performances, the stunning building by architect John Gaw Meem is located just on the northern edge of Downtown Colorado Springs.

### ***Garden of the Gods Park (ROUTE HIGHLIGHT)***

Voted number #1 city park in the USA, the Garden of the Gods is a National Natural Landmark that boasts some of the best views in Colorado Springs. A 1323 acre park is made up of sandstone rock formations reaching as tall as 300-feet and provides a scenic backdrop of Pikes Peak.

You can learn how the red rocks were formed with the Geo-Trekker theater experience; you can delight in one of Colorado's most photographed views while eating in the glass-enclosed cafe or from the terrace overlooking Pikes Peak and Garden of the Gods; and you can take a bus, Segway or Jeep tour through one of nature's greatest treasures: Garden of the Gods Park.

### ***Pikes Peak-America's Mountain (ROUTE HIGHLIGHT - VISIBLE FROM ROUTE)***

Sitting at 14,115 feet, this Colorado Rocky Mountain icon is visible from almost anywhere in the city. The summit is easily accessible via the Pikes Peak Highway, Barr Trail or The Broadmoor Pikes Peak Cog Railway, the highest cog railway in the world. The view is so breathtaking, the purple mountain majesty inspired Katharine Lee Bates to write a poem after her trip to the summit that later became the famous and beloved song "America the Beautiful."

### ***Manitou Incline***

Known as one of, if not the most, popular and challenging hike in the Colorado Springs area, The Manitou Incline gains almost 2,000 feet of elevation over less than one mile. It was

originally built as a cable car to carry materials to build pipelines on Pikes Peak-America's Mountain. Now that the pipelines are finished, it has turned into a true Colorado workout that is enjoyed by locals, Olympic athletes and cyclists from around the world, and military personnel. It also serves as a tourist attraction to bring guests to the top of the foothills for a spectacular view of Colorado Springs and the eastern plains.

### ***Glen Eyrie***

This English Tudor-style castle built in 1871 just north of the Garden of the Gods rock formations, once served as the home of General William Jackson Palmer, the founder of Colorado Springs. It is now owned by The Navigators, a Christian parachurch organization, and can be rented for private programs. Glen Eyrie also provides public tours and events such as English teas, marriage getaways, men and women retreats and more.

### ***The Broadmoor Pikes Peak Cog Railway***

The highest cog railway in the world made its first trip up Pikes Peak the afternoon of June 30th, 1891. This three hour and ten-minute trip runs year-round and spans over miles of track. Passengers enjoy stunning views, alpine tundra, yellow-bellied marmots and bighorn sheep. The last four kilometers of the trip are all above timberline. To the east stretch the Great Plains out beyond the border of Colorado and Kansas.

### Local Historical Facts

General Information on Colorado Springs:

- Founded: 1871 by: General William Jackson Palmer
- No. 40 Largest City in the U.S.
- Elevation: 6,035 feet, the city stands over 1 mile above sea level
- Population: 416,427
- It is the second most populous city in the state of Colorado.
- Climate: semi-arid
  - Drastic day-to day variability in weather conditions.
  - The city has abundant sunshine year-round, averaging 243 sunny days per year.
  - The city receives an average of 38 inches of snow per season.
- The economy is driven primarily by the military, the defense industry, high-tech industry and tourism. Tourism is the third largest employer in the Pikes Peak region. Nearly 5 million visitors come to the area annually.
- The city is home to 5 nearby military sites: the U.S. Air Force Academy, Cheyenne Mountain Air Force Station, Peterson Air Force Base, Schriever Air Force Base and Fort Carson Army Base. The city is home to NORAD, a United States and Canada bi-national organization charged with the missions of aerospace warning and aerospace control for North America.
- 20 institutions of higher education are located in the city or in its surrounding, including the U.S. Air Force Academy, Colorado College and University of Colorado Colorado Springs.
- More than 10,000 athletes train at the Colorado Springs Olympic Training Center each year; The Olympic & Paralympic Movements employ 2,100 local citizens.

## Event Guide

Known for:

- Before being founded by General Palmer, several American Indian nations including the Ute, Cheyenne, and Arapaho subsisted in the Colorado Springs Area.
- In the early 1800s, The U.S. government sent Zebulon Montgomery Pike to map the new area brought into the country with the Louisiana Purchase. Pikes Peak would later claim his name after he published the first book describing the area and encouraging travelers to visit.
- The town was founded as a resort destination in 1871.
- The Manitou and Pikes Peak Cog Railway was first created in 1889 providing an easier mode of transportation for travelers to reach the summit of Pikes Peak. The Cog Railway continues to transport travelers to the summit today.
- In 1890, the discovery of gold on the western slope of Pikes Peak brought the Colorado gold rush to Colorado Springs. Cripple Creek became a destination among miners in the area and is still being mined today.
- The first Pikes Peak Hill Climb race was held in 1916 with the conclusion of the Pikes Peak Highway.
- Camp Carson was opened by the U.S. Army in 1942. Since then, Colorado Springs has become a strong military presence with the U.S. Air Force Academy, NORAD, Peterson Air Force Base, the U.S. Space Command, and Schriever Air Force Base.
- In 1978, the U.S. Olympic Committee moved their headquarters from New York City to Colorado Springs establishing the city as the center for amateur sports in the country.

## Local Favorite Rides

### Mountain Bike Rides

#### ***Falcon Trail at the U.S. Air Force Academy***

An amazing single track loop trail runs through the vast grounds of the U.S. Air Force Academy. With beautiful views throughout, the trail has extended long climbs along with smooth downhill sections that become moderately technical at times. Distance: 13 miles; Avg. Time: 2 hour 15 min.

### ***Cheyenne Mountain State Park***

A single track trail system through the State Park combines several trails to provide a great biking experience for riders of all skill levels. Trails ranging from easy to difficult meander up the mountain through roller-coaster like hills, rolling curves, and light technical sections without any huge drop offs. Distance: 20 miles of trails

### ***Red Rock Canyon Open Space***

The Open Space offers a smooth single track trail that weaves in and out of red rock formations and valleys. With several trail interconnected throughout the space, riders can customize the length of this exhilarating ride while enjoying views of majestic Pikes Peak. Distance: 15 miles of trails

### ***Ute Valley Park***

A series of unmarked trails is a combination of both fast technical sections along with smooth riding non-technical sections. The single track is rated as intermediate with a loop form making it easy for riders to customize the length of their rides. Distance: 12 miles of trails

### ***Palmer Park***

A favorite ride of many throughout the area, Palmer Park offers a broad range of single track riding. From advanced technical sections to smooth roadways, the park provides trails for all skill levels with views of both Pikes Peak and Downtown Colorado Springs. Distance: 25 miles of trails

### ***Sante Fe Trail***

This trail provides easy riding that winds through many communities in the area, the U.S. Air Force Academy, and the outskirts of Downtown Colorado Springs. The ride offers a scenic tour of the area without technical sections making it an ideal ride for beginners and families.

Distance: 17 miles of trails

### **Road Bike Rides**

#### ***U.S. Air Force Academy***

This road ride takes riders through the heart of the U.S. Air Force Academy. With minimal gains in elevation, the road provides a steady excursion passing many notable landmarks of the Academy including Falcon Stadium, Cadet Chapel, and the Air Force Academy Visitor Center.

Distance: 13.6 miles of trails

### ***Pikes Peak Highway***

Pikes Peak Highway offers one of the most challenging road rides anywhere in the United States. The Highway makes a 4,880 ft. climb in elevation from the gate to the summit at 14,115 ft. with several meandering turns throughout. Although there is a \$12 fee to ride, the road provides an exceptional challenging ride for anyone looking to make the climb with great views of the Collegiate Peaks to the west. Distance: 12.5 (one way); Avg. Time: 2 – 5 hours (one way)

### ***Pikes Peak Greenway Trail***

This trail provides easy riding from the north (U.S. Air Force Academy) into the heart of Downtown Colorado Springs, then south to The Broadmoor World Arena. Many portions of the trail are paved, and much runs alongside Monument and Fountain creeks. Easy for beginners and families. Distance: 15+ miles

### ***Legacy Loop***

The 10-mile loop encircling Downtown Colorado Springs. Mostly paved, some gravel. All ages and abilities. Easy hop on/off trail along the Pikes Peak Greenway Trail, just east of Downtown Colorado Springs. [www.facebook.com/legacyloopCOS](http://www.facebook.com/legacyloopCOS) Distance: 10 miles; Avg. Time: 2 hours

### ***Can't Miss Ride***

With a start in the beautiful downtown Acacia Park, you are led through the scenic Garden of the Gods. Three diverse landscapes balance this ride with differing levels of difficulty and some of the most breathtaking views in all of Colorado. Distance: 20.6 miles; Avg. Time: 2 hours
