

Air Force Football Quarterback

Many consider him the greatest quarterback in At-Force football bistory, directing the lethal Falcon wishbone triple option offense with tremendous skill. Dowis became the Air Force Academy's alllitine career rushing leader with 3,612 yards, which was an NCA4 record for a quarterback at the COLORU inten. In his enfor var (1989) be leaded sixth in the voting

for the Heisman Trophy (won by University of Houston quarterback Andre Ware). During the 1989 season, he became only the fifth player in NCAA history to run and pass for at least 1,000 yards in one season. He was the starter for the Falcons in 1987-89 as Air Force roared to 22 wins and two bowl games and was named to the Air Force Airhleit: Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2009. He held a number of AFA records, among them touchdowns (6) in a game (vs. San Diego State 1989) and most points scored in a career

Static 1969) and most pouns scored in a career (252). He also recorded four 200-yard rushing games, 6,482 yards in total offense, and ran for 41 touchdowns during his career. Dowls grew up in Royston, Georgia, also the home of baseball immortal Ty Cobb.
