Gambucci, who grew up in the ice hockey hotbed of Eveleth, Minnesota, is a sports legend at Colorado College. He was a player on the 1950 NCAA Ice Hockey Championship Team for the Tigers, and was a football and baseball star. He scored 16 touchdowns as a running back for the Tigers in 1953 and broke Earl "Dutch" Clark's record that same year to finish fourth nationally in scoring and played centerfield for the baseball team. He was selected to the 1952 U.S. Olympic Men's



Ice Hockey Team for the Games in Oslo and came home with a silver medal. Following his graduation at CC, he was offered a spot in the NHL by the Boston Bruins, but went to Italy to play and coach. He returned to Colorado Springs to become a WCHA referee and built a very successful insurance business before his retirement. Gambucci was inducted into the Colorado College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2004.
